

FRED L. OGILVIE, M. D. (Democrat), Representative from Scott county; born March 3, 1878, at Charleston, Mo.; educated in the Charleston public and high schools, Baptist College at Farmington, and the medical department of St. Louis University. In the World War was a captain in the Medical Corps and stationed at Ft. Riley, later at Camp Henry Knox in Kentucky. He is president of Citizens Bank at Blodgett, Mo., where he also practices medicine. In the 52nd General Assembly was chairman of Committee on Public Health and Scientific Affairs. Member of the following committees: Banks and Banking; Fish and Game; Immigration; Swamp Lands, Drainage and Levees.

WILLIAM R. PECK (Democrat), Representative from Dent county; born in that county October 15, 1865; educated in the public schools of Salem, where he now resides, and is engaged as a merchant. He was married December 8, 1898, at Salem to Miss Nettie Rouse. He was a member of the 43rd and 46th General Assemblies. In the 52nd General Assembly was chairman of Committee on Engrossed Bills, and member of Committees on Fire, Marine and Tornado Insurance; Immigration; Roads and Highways.

WILLIAM SMITH PELTS (Republican), Representative from Dade county; born in the county he now represents on April 10, 1871; educated in the public schools. He was married January 11, 1901, to Miss Eliza Sanders, who died in 1915. In 1917 he was married to Mrs. Florence Carlock Thompson. He is active in church work and was president of the Dade County Sunday School Association, 1916-18. He was a member of the 42nd, 49th, 50th and 51st General Assemblies. In the 52nd General Assembly served on the following committees: Engrossed Bills; Federal Relations; Retrenchment and Reform.

HARRY R. PENCE (Democrat), Representative from St. Clair county; born at Roscoe, Mo., October 23, 1893; educated in the public schools of St. Clair county, Appleton City Academy and University of Missouri. He was married at Fayette, Mo., September 21, 1916, to Miss Goldie Mae Dinkle, and resides at Roscoe, where he is engaged as a merchant and automobile dealer. He was a member of the Democratic County Committee from 1919 to 1922. In the 52nd General Assembly was a member of the following committees: Appropriations; Engrossed Bills; Joint Rules; University and School of Mines; Military Affairs.

GARNETT M. PETERS (Democrat), Representative from Clay county; born in Clinton county, Missouri, May 31, 1870; educated in the public schools and Spaulding's Commercial College. He was deputy assessor of Clay county in 1906-12, and has since then been engaged in the insurance business at Liberty. He was a member of the 51st General Assembly; re-elected to the 52nd, in which he served as chairman of Committee on Ways and Means, and as member of Committees on Criminal Jurisprudence; Printing, and Wills and Probate Laws.

GERHARD PLASSMEYER (Republican), Representative from Osage county; born at Westphalia, Germany. He came to America in 1857, and has resided at Westphalia, Mo., since that time; educated in the Missouri public and parochial schools. He was married April 21, 1885, to Miss Elizabeth Helteeman. He is president of the Bank of Westphalia; was a justice of the peace at twenty-four years of age and served four years as assessor, two years as deputy collector, two years as judge of the county court, four years as highway engineer; elected to the 49th and 51st General Assemblies; re-elected to the 52nd, in which he served on the following committees: Building and Loan; Educational; Ways and Means.

W. A. PORTER, M. D., D. V. S. (Republican), Representative from Lafayette county; born March 23, 1862, in Johnson county, and received his education in the public schools of that county, the American Veterinary College of New York and the Medico-Chirurgical Medical College at Kansas City, Mo. Was married July 20, 1882, to Miss Nancy J. Taylor, who died July 23, 1911, and on July 20, 1921, he was married to Miss Bessie Howard at Jefferson City, Mo. He taught in both the Western Veterinary College and the University Veterinary College of Kansas City, Mo. Is a practicing physician, living at Higginsville, and is a breeder of high class registered bird dogs. He was constable of Grover township, Johnson county, alderman of Sedalia, coroner of Monticau county, member of the school board and mayor of Tipton, and is serving his third consecutive term as Representative from Lafayette county. In 1921 was appointed physician of the Confederate Soldiers' Home at Higginsville, Mo. In the 52nd General Assembly served on the following committees:

RALPH WALDO POWELL (Republican), Representative from Stone county; born August 2, 1876, at Lamar, Mo.; educated in the public schools and Drury College at Springfield. He was married June 21, 1900, at Springfield to Miss Laura W. Walker. He was a justice of peace for four years and at present resides at Reed's Spring, where he is engaged in farming and stock raising, and in the operation of Fairy Cave. In the 52nd General Assembly was a member of the following committees: Commerce and Manufactories; Fish and Game; Immigration.
